TRUSTEE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF THE SOUTH (SEWANEE)

As an owning Diocese, The Episcopal Diocese of Upper South Carolina elects one Clergy Trustee and three Lay Trustees for the University of the South (Sewanee) on a rotating schedule. As a Trustee of the University of the South, you are required to attend new Trustee training as well as the annual meeting of the Board of Trustees in Sewanee, Tennessee in the fall.

DEPUTIES TO THE 81ST GENERAL CONVENTION OF THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH

The 81st General Convention of The Episcopal Church will be held in July 2024 in Louisville, Kentucky.

The four candidates in each order who receive the highest number of votes (majority of votes cast) shall be elected as Deputies to The General Convention. The four candidates in each order receiving the next highest number of votes cast shall be considered alternates in the order of their votes and considered duly elected.

Due to Covid-19, The 80th General Convention of The Episcopal Church was delayed from 2021 to 2022. To get back on the traditional three-year meeting schedule, The 81st General Convention will take place two years after the 80th General Convention, in 2024.

Deputies attend a series of meetings and serve on various General Convention Committees. In addition, the Deputies attend The General Convention, at Diocesan expense, which normally runs between six to eight days.
