Canon Myra B. Garnes, Keynote Speaker Canon for Youth & Young Adult Ministries Episcopal Diocese of Long Island

Prior to her arrival in NY, she was the Director of the Cathedral Scholars Program at the Washington National Cathedral in DC and served as an Academic Class Dean and Director of Multicultural Education at the National Cathedral School in DC. She was installed as an Honorary Canon to the Cathedral of the Incarnation in the Diocese of Long Island in 2015.

Canon Myra serves the larger church in several capacities as the Province II Youth Ministry Network Coordinator and as a former member of the Forma Board of Directors. She is a Youth Ministry Liaison for The Episcopal Church Office of Youth Ministries, a member of the Black Ministries Council of Advice and was honored with the Distinguished Leadership Award from the Office of Young Adult/Campus Ministry for The Episcopal Church during General Convention in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Canon Myra is an experienced social justice educator with extensive training and experience on issues of diversity, multiculturalism, leadership, and student development. Her professional work as a student affairs administrator led her to several leadership roles on college and university campuses across the country including Macalester College, Loyola University Chicago, Appalachian State University and The Ohio State University. Myra has served as a Facilitator for the Anti-Defamation League's (ADL) A World of Difference Institute, a Cluster Facilitator for The LeaderShape Institute, and a Facilitator for the National Coalition Building Institute's (NCBI) Prejudice Reduction and Leadership Models.

The Rev. Furman Buchanan

The Rev. Furman L. Buchanan is the rector of St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Greenville, S.C. He began serving St. Peter's in 2010 as priest-in-charge, and was subsequently called by the vestry as the parish's fourth rector. Prior to this call, Furman served as an associate priest at St. Martin's-in-the-Fields in Columbia. Beyond parochial ministry, Furman served on the Diocesan Executive Council and Standing Committee (2010-2013), and as the diocesan ecumenical officer and liaison to the LARCUM community of bishops from



approximately 2008 until 2016. At the Diocesan Convention of 2016 he was elected as chair of the deputation for the 2018 General Convention. Furman is also serving as chair of the Commission on the Episcopal Church and the Anglican Communion.

In 2019, Furman's book, *Gifts of God for the People of God: Exploring Worship in the Episcopal Church*, was published by Forward Movement. Using biblical and personal stories, the book helps readers connect with the words and actions of the Holy Eucharist, and also reflect on their own stories which mingle with God's story of love and life as revealed to us in worship.

Morgan and Lena Lee

Morgan and Lena Lee are living their lives together. They have been married for 20 years and continue to love life together. They love to share their stories and include their 16-year-old son, Chapman Sojourner Lee, in many of them.

Race, racism, racial reconciliation and their own shared histories play a major role in their lives together and as individuals. Both Morgan and Lena attempt to live out their baptismal covenant... especially the part about striving



for justice and peace and respecting the dignity of every human being. Morgan and Lena are parishioners at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Columbia. In addition to attempting to be faithful people, Lena sings on the choir and Morgan is a team leader of the justice ministry (MORE Justice) at Trinity. Morgan also serves as the new co-chair of the Diocesan Race and Reconciliation Committee. One of their favorite activities each day is to sit on their front porch in their rocking chairs and share stories of their day with one another while watching neighbors go by, enjoying the diversity of their neighborhood and the beauty that is God's creation.

The Rev. Deacon Leslie "Fergie" Horvath

The Rev. Leslie 'Fergie' Horvath is a Deacon in the Episcopal Diocese of Upper SC. Currently she is a postulant for Holy Orders to the priesthood and is in her first year of studies at Virginia Theological Seminary. In the diocese, she has served on the Matthew 25



Committee, the Bishop's Search Committee, and the Diocesan Ecclesiastical Board. She is an EfM graduate. Fergie has participated in outreach experiences in her hometown of Spartanburg: Cumberland, Tennessee; White Horse, South Dakota; New York City after 9/11; Ecuador; Haiti; and Mississippi after Hurricane Katrina. She led several mission trips to Alabama after the tornado outbreak of April 2011, and led a trip to Staten Island, NY after Hurricane Sandy. Fergie is an experienced retreat leader, quiet day facilitator, conference presenter and Christian Formation teacher. She is also a volunteer chaplain for the Spartanburg County Sheriff's Office and has completed classes in Chaplaincy, Grief, Mass Casualty Disasters, Critical Incident Stress Management, Pastoral Crisis, and setting up a Family Assistance Center. When she's not in Virginia at school, she lives with her husband Gary in Spartanburg.

In this session, we will look at what happens between God and us during our baptism and after our baptism. Come see how vocation fits into baptismal living!


Baptismal Living through Holy Thanksgiving (Rm 203) The Rev. Furman Buchanan


